PRAYER:

MONDAY

Matthew 16:24-27

PRAYER:

The Gospel has its price

PRAYER REQUEST:

Denying ourselves means giving control of our lives to the Lord. And taking up the cross is being willing to suffer rejection for having completely given ourselves to Christ; dying to sin, to self and to the world. Being held by the hand of the Lord, we will be certain that he will not allow us to go through moments that we cannot resist. Let us give immense thanks to God for having chosen us to achieve this beautiful experience of living as he wants us to live, in love, humility, compassion, purity, grace and holiness.



Hebrews 12: 1-3

PRAYER:

Let's not look away

PRAYER REQUEST:

Throughout our lives, we should look away from everything that prevents us from looking at CHRIST. Jesus is our pure example of what our faith should be; He not only started the race, but finished it victorious. His career began in Bethlehem, he continued to Gethsemane and Calvary, then to the grave and back to heaven. He kept his gaze fixed toward the glory to come when all the redeemed will be eternally reunited with our redeemer. Let us pray to the Father to help us value the sacrifice of Christ and to remain firm in faith, walking towards our future encounter with our savior.



Psalms 51: 1-3

PRAYER:

The cross has power to heal our lives

PRAYER REQUEST:

We have all done things at some point that we have regretted, but despite this, guilt follows us. To be freed from this anguish we must reach out to Christ in prayer, understanding that he brought to the cross the record of the decrees that were against us and made us free from sin and death. Let us pray that the Lord will give us the opportunity to witness to others that he forgave our past and has filled us with hope and blessing.



Matthew 27: 27-31

PRAYER:

He is King of our lives

PRAYER REQUEST:

The cruel soldiers committed the most outrageous cruelty against the King of Kings, one of them was to cast a scarlet cloak on him, which is associated with sin (Isaiah 1:18); representing that our sin was cast upon Jesus, that the mantle of God's righteousness might be cast upon us. Let us pray that, during this Passion Week, we can share this powerful story and many can receive Christ as their only Savior.



Galatians 3: 13-14

PRAYER:

We are no longer under curse

PRAYER REQUEST:

To redeem is to recover through purchase and release by paying the corresponding price. The Galatians imagined that Christ had redeemed them half, and that they had to acquire the rest by subjecting themselves to Jewish rites and ceremonies. Paul reminds us that Abraham's blessing is actually salvation by grace through Faith. Let us pray that each day we long to read and learn more of the word, so as not to be confused and to be able to teach others with wisdom and authority.



1 Thessalonians 4: 13-17

PRAYER:

Let's know God's perfect plans

PRAYER REQUEST:

Just as the Disciples were surprised and cried at the death of their friend and teacher Jesus, so we too are saddened by the absence of our family members who have passed away. We Christians cry, but not as those who have no hope, but as those who understand that, if Christ was resurrected, we will also be resurrected with Him, at His due time. Let us pray giving thanks for that blessed hope that we have in Jesus Christ and that he will help us in all our grieving processes.



Psalms 42: 1-2

PRAYER:

Let us say with a loud voice and conviction: "My savior lives!"

PRAYER REQUEST:

How powerful are these words of the Psalmist, we see here his immense desire to be in the presence of the living God who quenches every Spiritual thirst.
